Melbourne jewellery designer Lucy Folk has cast moulds of some of her favourite foods and cooked up a quirky jewellery range.

Having been involved in the food industry with her family-run business, the Observatory Cafe, Folk says food is a subject that is close to home.

"Making everyday things we adore to eat become precious things that we love to wear is part of my skill. The results put a smile on the face of the wearer, and feed your eyes instead of your belly."

Last year, Folk launched her first solo show — aptly named Nibbles — at the Pieces of Eight Workshop gallery space in North Fitzroy. One piece was a crochet necklace of hot dogs.

Her new collection, More Nibbles, features popcorn, pretzels, burger rings and corn-chip pendants in solid silver, and in some cases 24ct gold plating, which hang from sterling silver chains.
